



Metro Atlanta, the global capital in the sunny Southeast, has always been built for business. The region's dramatic growth is carving a path to a sustainable future.

POPULATION

Metro Atlanta, the bustling capital of the Southeast, is a magnet for tomorrow's workforce and a mosaic of welcoming hometowns. It's the eighth-largest and one of the fastest-growing areas in the nation.

Home to more than 6.4 million people in 2024, Atlanta's 29-county Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) experienced the third-largest population increase of all MSAs in the nation – an increase of 799,320 people from 2014 to 2024.

The region's Asian American population grew by 42.9%, 136,609 people, between 2014 and 2023. The Hispanic or Latino population grew by 37.6%, 226,911 people, since 2014. Hispanic or Latino residents make up 13% of metro Atlanta's population. 16.0% of metro Atlanta residents are foreign born.


BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY

With the amenities of an international crossroads and lower cost of doing business than peer regions, Metro Atlanta was built for business. As the capital of the most business-friendly state in the country, this has always been a place where opportunity can become reality. One of the largest economies in the nation with a GDP of more than \$570 billion, metro Atlanta's business community keeps rising.

Home to headquarters of 33 of America's largest corporations (Fortune 1000), including 15 ranked in the elite Fortune 500, as well as more than 200 of the nation's fastest-growing private companies (Inc. 5000), metro Atlanta is a premier location for the headquarters of companies across industries. The region has also attracted more than 30 corporate innovation centers.

Atlanta is a global business hub, home to nearly 1,000 international companies. Flights from Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, the busiest and most efficient airport in the world, travel nonstop to 70 international and 150 domestic destinations. 30+ bi-national Chambers of Commerce are located in the region, in addition to more than 60 Consular Offices, 26 of which are Consuls General representing their countries as posted diplomats in Atlanta.

A business-friendly environment and low cost of doing business are key elements for why companies choose metro Atlanta. Area Development magazine ranked Georgia the #1 state for doing business for the last eleven years (2014-2024).



SKILLED AND DIVERSE TALENT

PRE-K THROUGH 12TH GRADE

Metro Atlanta's talent pipeline is robust. More than one million students are served through its 37 public school systems, including more than 1,100 elementary, middle and high schools. Metro Atlanta is also home to approximately 350 private schools.

Georgia offers free pre-K classes for four-year-old children throughout the state. The pre-K program is a lottery-funded educational program.

Metro Atlanta has several immersion schools, both public/charter and private, that teach in languages other than English, including Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese and Spanish. English-as-a-Second Language courses are available in every public school district.

There are 66 International Baccalaureate World Schools in Georgia. These authorized schools offer one or more IB education programs.

Schools in the metro area offer a wide variety of education for children with special needs. Supported by unique organizations like the Marcus Autism Center and the Atlanta Speech School, public and private schools offer access to a variety of educational resources.

HIGHER EDUCATION

A greenhouse for smart, skilled talent, metro Atlanta has more than 300,000 students enrolled in 70+ two- and four-year college and university campuses in the metro Atlanta/Athens area. Businesses in the region benefit from a large and thriving pipeline of homegrown talent. Atlanta has multiple R1 universities ± institutions classified as Doctoral Universities with high research activity. Approximately 64,000 degrees are awarded in the metro Atlanta/Athens area annually (associate's, bachelor's, master's and doctorate).

Approximately 23% of Georgia State University's enrollment is first-generation college students and it is the #1 public or nonprofit university in the U.S. to confer undergraduate degrees to Black students.



EDUCATION AND TALENT

The Georgia Institute of Technology leads the nation in the number of engineering bachelor's degrees awarded and is ranked #1 in the nation for its Civil Engineering and Industrial Engineering programs. All of the school's graduate engineering programs rank in the top 10. The school awards more engineering bachelor's degrees to minorities and women than any other school in the country.

Emory University is ranked among the top national universities. Emory's undergraduate nursing school is ranked #1 in the country, and its graduate public health program is #3. This private university includes a top-performing School of Medicine, School of Law, and the Goizueta Business School.

Metro Atlanta is home to the Atlanta University Center (AUC) Consortium, the world's oldest and largest association of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). The AUC is comprised of four member institutions: Clark Atlanta University, Morehouse College, Morehouse School of Medicine, and Spelman College. Spelman College is the #1 HBCU in the nation.

The **HOPE Scholarship and HOPE Grants** are funds available for qualified Georgia residents that provide assistance towards the cost of tuition at eligible public and private colleges and universities.

HOPE Career Grants waive tuition for qualified students enrolling in specific high-demand fields in Georgia's Technical Colleges, including 18 programs of study like automotive technology, nursing, health science, commercial truck driving and movie production set design.





GOVERNMENT

Atlanta is the capital city of the state of Georgia. One of the most recognizable features of the downtown Atlanta skyline is the state Capital lined with gold.

The 29 counties that make up metro Atlanta are individually governed by boards of commissioners, city councils and mayors. The region is marked by its bipartisan stable governance and consistent business-friendly policies on a state level.

Atlanta's symbol is the phoenix, the legendary bird of Egyptian mythology, representing Atlanta's rise from the ashes of the Civil War. The seal of the city bears the phoenix and the Latin term "Re-surgens," which means "rising again."

TAXES

Georgia's tax structure is among the most stable in the country, with a consistent AAA bond rating from all three agencies. Georgia's corporate income tax rate is 5.39% (single factor sales tax apportionment). In the metro Atlanta region of 29 counties, the total (state and local) sales tax rate ranges from 6% (Cherokee, Cobb and Gwinnett counties) to 8.9% (City of Atlanta in Fulton and DeKalb counties).

Georgia has a graduated individual income tax rate based on an individual's federal adjusted gross income. Effective July 1, 2024, the state has instituted a flat tax rate of 5.39% for all individuals.

Property tax rates (millage rates) are set locally by each county and city. Real and personal property are assessed at 40% of fair market value.

HEALTH CARE

Metro Atlanta offers access to an extensive healthcare system with more than 100 hospitals, 84,000 hospital workers, and 34,000 nurses and nurse practitioners. The system includes two Level 1 trauma centers, two Level 2, three Level 3, two Level 4, two pediatric trauma centers and one designated burn center.

A few of Metro Atlanta's top-ranked medical facilities include:

Shepherd Center | Ranked #18 nationally and #1 in Adult Specialties, Shepherd Center is a private, not-for-profit hospital in Atlanta that specializes in treating, researching, and rehabilitating spinal cord injury and stroke.

Children's Healthcare of Atlanta | CHOA's pediatric research program is ranked in the top 5 for National Institute of Health funding among pediatric departments nationwide.


Northside Hospital The nation's leader in maternity services, Northside Hospital delivers more babies a year than any other hospital in the country and was recently designated as a Level IV maternal center.

In addition to high-quality patient care facilities, metro Atlanta is home to renowned medical search organizations like the **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Center for Global Health Innovation.**



COST OF LIVING


■ COST OF LIVING INDEX 2024: SELECT U.S. METROS

TRANSPORTATION

With unparalleled connectivity, Atlanta is home to the world's busiest and most efficient airport, plus the planes, trucks, trains and ports to keep business moving swiftly. In 2024, CNBC, ranked GA #1 for infrastructure.

AIR CARGO

Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport is served by more than 20 all-cargo air carriers. Nearly 650,000 metric tons of cargo passed through ATL in 2024.

AIR SERVICE

ATL, the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, is a true global leader and one of the most connected airports on the planet. The single busiest and most efficient airport in the world, its five runways serve more than 105 million passengers a year. More than 80% of U.S. metros are within a two-hour flight from Atlanta.

HIGHWAYS

Three major highways (I-75, I-85, I-20) converge near Atlanta's central business district.

The perimeter highway (I-285) circles the city in a 62.7-mile loop. Georgia 400 is a six-lane highway providing yet another route to the city via north metro Atlanta.

Atlanta's major highways contain High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) and High Occupancy Toll (HOT) lanes, which decrease drive times during peak hours and are freeof-charge to electric vehicles.

RAIL

Abundant rail service makes metro Atlanta the rail center of the Southeast.

More than 4,600 railroad miles in Georgia – the largest intermodal hub in the region. Served by two class-one railroads (CSX and Norfolk Southern) and over 20 short-line companies.

MASS TRANSIT

The region's heavy rail and bus service, MARTA, serves 1.7 million travelers. Every weekday, over 200,000 people are transported by MARTA. With 38 rail stations, including direct access in Hartsfield-Jackson airport, and over 100 bus routes covering over 1,400 miles, MARTA's operations are vast. Rapid bus services like Cobb County Transit and Gwinnett County Transit connect to MARTA.

INLAND PORTS

Georgia currently hosts two inland port facilities with a third planned. The model allows containers to be trucked for shorter distances and staged at an intermodal yard, where they are loaded onto trains moving hundreds of containers in a single trip.

OCEAN

The Port of Savannah, located 250 miles from Atlanta, is the largest and fastest-growing single-container terminal in North America.

The Port of Brunswick, located 300 miles from Atlanta, is the busiest port in the U.S. for import and export of Ro/Ro (Roll-On/Roll-Off) vehicle cargo. In 2024, its volume increased by 7.5%, continuing its record-breaking trend from FY 2023, which saw an 18% rise compared to the previous year.





MAJOR ATTRACTIONS

THE ATLANTA BELTLINE Among the largest, most wide-ranging urban redevelopment programs in the United States, this network of public parks, multi-use trails, planned transit and affordable housing spans a historic 22-mile railroad corridor. **www.beltline.org**

ATLANTA BOTANICAL GARDEN | Located on 30 acres in Midtown, the Atlanta Botanical Garden is an urban oasis, maintaining plant and art collections for display, education, research, conservation and enjoyment. www.atlantabg.org

THE CARTER CENTER | Founded by former U.S. President Jimmy Carter and activist Rosalynn Carter, the Center is committed to waging peace, fighting disease and building hope around the world. www.cartercenter.org

THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME | The Chick-fil-A College Football Hall of Fame celebrates and honors the people, traditions and passion of college football. The Hall is 95,000 square feet of more than 50 engaging exhibits. **www.cfbhall.com**

GEORGIA AQUARIUM The largest aquarium in the Western Hemisphere with more than 10 million gallons of water, the Georgia Aquarium contains hundreds of exhibits and tens of thousands of animals across seven galleries. www.georgiaaquarium.com

FOX THEATRE The beautiful historic Fox Theatre, featuring unique Moorish architecture, is one of Atlanta's premier venues. Each year it holds more than 150 performances, ranging from national touring Broadway shows to popular musicians to a summer film series. **www.foxtheatre.org**



ATLANTA BELTLINE A 22-mile loop of trails, parks, and transit connecting neighborhoods and transforming urban living.

PIEDMONT PARK | A true urban oasis of 185 acres in Midtown Atlanta.

SILVER COMET TRAIL A scenic 61.5-mile paved path near Atlanta, perfect for walking, biking, and connecting with nature.


